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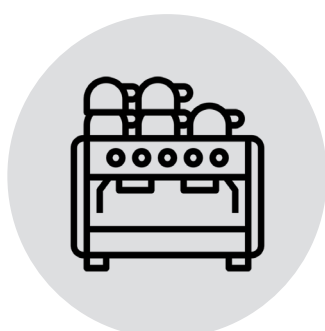

Your first car is so much more than just a mode of transport; it's freedom and responsibility, a safe space all to yourself, and for some their passion and a hobby.

Regardless of what car you ultimately end up behind the wheel of, a motor vehicle represents a significant outlay and ongoing cost for any young person; it's usually their first big purchase in life. The last thing you want is to save up and buy a car that turns out to be unreliable, unsafe, damaged, or simply not what you really needed/wanted!

This workshop is intended to provide young people with the skills and knowledge needed to identify and purchase a suitable first car, and minimise the chance that they are taken advantage of and sold a "lemon". 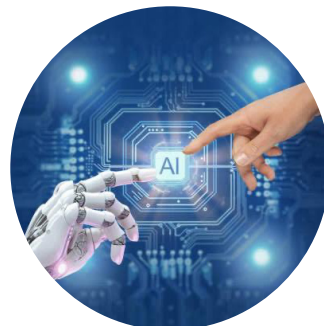
